The e-2005 - eChallenges Advance Programme has just been published and features contributions from government, business and research from 37 countries in Europe, Africa, Asia & North America. For three days in October, from **19th – 21st October 2005**, researchers, government officials and representatives from the business community will come together to the beautiful city of Ljubljana, Slovenia to share experiences, lessons learnt and challenges for the future.

Celebrating its fifteenth anniversary this year e-2005's objective is to stimulate rapid take-up of Research & Technology Development (RTD) results by European Industry, and SMEs in particular. **eChallenges** aims to provide a forum to share RTD success stories and lessons learnt from Information and Communications Technology (ICT) related Regional, National European & Internationally funded research.

e-2005 has attracted sponsorship from the European Commission, Ministry of Higher Education, Science and Technology Slovenia, Hewlett-Packard Europe and IBM looking forward to FP7 and international co-operation.

The **e2005 Competitive Call for exhibitors** is now open with priority given to those proposing to demonstrate innovative technology. A separate call will be open to Slovenian organisations wishing to be showcased in the Slovenian ICT pavilion.
