Ltd., Japan; and Todd Ramsey, General Manager, IBM.

Tackling New ICT Challenges

e-2005 looks set to be an inspiring event presenting new challenges and opportunities in technology and research, as well as helping delegates leverage on EU Framework Programmes FP6 and FP7. The main goal of eChallenges e-2005 is to promote research and technology development (RTD) that is usable in the European public sector, industry and by SMEs, bringing benefits to any organisation aiming to co-operate and learn about IST.

Chris Horn of IONA Technologies noted that "eChallenges e2005 Conference will bring together key players and professionals in the commercial, government and research sectors across Europe, and indeed from North America, Asia and Africa, and as a result will be amongst the most significant industry events in Europe this year."

(International Dimension of eChallenges Continues to Grow)

Nearly 8% of presenters this year are from outside Europe, which is almost double the figure for e-2004. The eChallenges Community Participants at e-2005 make up a balanced mixture of representatives from leading commercial, government and research organisations from around the world.

Over an eventful three days, delegates will participate in their choice of 70 Thematically Focused Paper and interactive Workshop Sessions, listening, reacting to and discussing over 270 presentations by delegates from 38 Countries in 5 continents. Topics addressed include:

- e-Business: distributed applications, GRID, interoperability, QOS, service oriented architectures; SME exploitation of eCommerce & eBusiness;
- e-Democracy: eVoting, eParticipation & political digital divide;
- e-Government: cross-border access to information, customer centric services, risk reduction in large-scale eGovernment projects, regional case studies, security issues, service models; survey of Citizen Service Number use in 12 EU Member States to access services;
- Knowledge Management: collaboration both within organisations and across organisational boundaries, semantic based knowledge retrieval, story telling techniques, sectoral applications in healthcare;
- Mobility: business models, GRID, IM applications, location based services, service quality, Mobility-Delphi study on the future of mobility & mobile services, security, standardisation, sectoral applications;

Networked, Smart & Virtual Organisations: distributed collaboration, innovation management and management challenges;

- New Working Environment: knowledge based SMEs, multi-modal interfaces, semantic web, ICT impact on sectors including automotive, construction, healthcare and transport;
- SME: eCommerce and eBusiness, interoperability, standardisation, supply chain management, barriers to SME takeup of Open Source Software (OSS);
- eLearning & Education: case studies, design issues, support applications, innovation management education. Workshop on skills and certification organised by CEPIS.
